

BSHM/CSHPM Draft Programme, 11 June 2021 – Timetable

Most presentations will be *pre-recorded* and made available the previous day. Plenaries will be pre-recorded and released, but will also be played live. The timetable allows participants to watch the relevant recordings immediately before the live session Q&A if they wish. Live Q&A sessions are all 40 mins, allowing time for a break, and a bit of slippage, before the zoom channel is needed for the next live session.

All live sessions are shown in **bold**.

Sessions are labelled by their zoom channel and live time *slot*. Some also have a qualifier: (S)=symposium, (P)=philosophy focused, (E)=education focused.
e.g.

1.2(S) = zoom channel 1, time slot 2, symposium

1.3(PS) = zoom channel 1, time slot 3, philosophy-focused symposium

2.3(E) = zoom channel 2, time slot 3, education focused

BST = British Summer Time, e.g. London (UTC+1)

EDT = Eastern Daylight Time, e.g. Toronto (UTC-4)

PDT = Pacific Daylight Time, e.g. Vancouver (UTC-7)
